Violet Rose was rescued as a kitten, but never completely got over her fear of people. Though she longs for affection and cuddling, she just never gained the confidence she needed to allow people to approach her. Will she ever be at ease around people?



**Dasher: I love laps—on my terms**

Dasher is a beautiful little girl, who is actually a lap-cat; but only with certain laps. She is terrified of everyone else. Can she learn to transfer her love for a few special people to love for the very special person who adopts her someday?
